### **Foreword**

I first laid eyes on Frank Barker about forty-six years ago as I was sitting in a theology classroom at Columbia Theological Seminary in Atlanta, Georgia. He was sitting in the back row with his chair tilted back, leaning against the wall, with a look of total bewilderment on his face. I didn't know at the time that he had arrived in seminary without ever coming to know the gospel or the meaning of salvation. Seminary was hard enough for a Christian, and for one whose eyes had not yet been opened to understanding spiritual things, it must have been totally incomprehensible. I could not have imagined at that time that this befuddled young man, in just a few months, was going to grasp the gospel, be completely transformed and go on to become one of the most effective ministers in the United States. But that is getting ahead of the story.

Though Frank had grown up in a church, by the time he went to college and then into the Naval Air Corps, he had pretty well jettisoned the principles that he had learned as a child, as so many other young people have done before and since. If he had grasped the gospel in those early years the next decade of his life would have been far different. But at that point he did not have ears to hear.

The story that the author tells so engagingly about his college career and his life flying jet planes off of carriers is often hair-raising. Over and over again he was rescued from the very precipice of death by God, who was evidently preserving his life for far greater things.

This was to come to a climax when after a weekend

of carousing, he was driving back to Pensacola Air Base along one of those deserted Alabama highways near the Florida border, when he went to sleep while traveling sixty miles per hour. The highway turned and he didn't. He found himself flying down a dirt road with trees flashing by on either side. He finally brought the car to a halt a few inches from a large pine tree on which was a sign that was to dramatically change his life.

It was not too long after that that he left the Naval Air Corps and came to seminary in order to make his life more pleasing to God. Having, after a few months, discovered the incredible good news of the grace of Christ and the free gift of eternal life, he went on to finish his education and then was called to Birmingham, Alabama, to start a new church. From that tiny beginning, through the indefatigable labors of Frank and his wife, Barbara, over a period of about forty years, was developed one of the great mega-churches of America.

This biography written so enthrallingly by authors Janie Buck and Mary Lou Davis, is filled with innumerable lessons in life. Lessons in what it means to be a humble servant of Christ; of what it means to live a life which is unquestionably totally dedicated to God; of what it means to forge, after a rocky beginning, a marriage which is genuinely a partnership in love; of what it means to rear godly children in the midst of an incredibly busy schedule; of what it means to trust God for all your daily needs while giving away the preponderance of your income to the work of Christ; of what it means to live for the glory of Christ in the midst of the accolade of this world.

I do not believe that anyone can read this exciting and moving story of lives lived for the kingdom of God without becoming a better person through the experience.
